FEATURED HUB - RAJBIRAJ, NEPAL

Welcome to Rajbiraj

Rajbiraj, the capital of Saptari district in Nepal's Madesh Province, is one of the country's poorest regions, facing high rates of school dropouts, gender-based violence, and inequality.

At the MCCF and CWB hub at PaBi School Ground, cricket is transforming lives. In partnership with Sabal Nepal and the Saptari Cricket Association, boys and girls are breaking down gender norms and creating new opportunities for girls in sport and life.



The ground, owned by the school but open to the public, is the heart of community cricket in Rajbiraj. Each evening, local coaches and Cricket
Changemakers lead training sessions, teaching the game and supporting girls in feeling safe and encouraged to play. Between 40 and 60 children train here daily, with satellite hubs in Khadak and Surunga attracting 20 participants.

In addition to coaching, the hub runs school sessions, organises inter-school matches, and conducts gender sensitisation workshops, involving players, families, and the community in promoting change.

Recent Ripple Effects Mapping workshops highlighted three key impacts: cricket fosters a supportive community, builds life skills such as confidence and leadership, and provides girls with greater freedom and opportunities in their local area.



Meet Cricket Changemaker and Province Player Bandana

Bandana, one of the Cricket Changemakers in Rajbiraj, has come a long way since joining PaBi ground two years ago as one of just four girls playing cricket. Seizing the chance to lead, she took on roles in data collection and coaching. Today, she runs inclusive sessions at PaBi and Narendra Ma Vi, while continuing her cricket development.

Coming from a poor rural family with illiterate parents, Bandana has achieved a lot in two years, growing as both a leader and player. She recently won Bowler of the Tournament at the Madhesh Province PM Cup and was selected for the Province team. This marked her first journey to the far West of Nepal to represent Madhesh, even appearing on live television.

Reflecting on the experience, Bandana shared, "I loved visiting new places, meeting new teams, and learning. My parents now support me even more, wanting me to work harder and go further!"



Clean Toilets for Dignified Menstruation

Sabal Nepal plays a key role in the Rajbiraj hub, especially in WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) initiatives. As a champion of dignified menstruation, Sabal has campaigned for menstrual health awareness through cricket.

In 2023, the Menstruation Cup campaign promoted dignity in menstruation, and in 2024, funds raised within the CWB community were used to renovate the toilet facilities at PaBi ground. The new toilets feature running water, a flush, and are maintained by caretaker Ranjit, who ensures cleanliness and charges a small fee to public users to sustain the facilities.






New hub started in Kisumu, Kenya.

Two new coaches, Cymprous and Sandra are now up and running in the new hub in Lira. The CWB volunteer team is scheduled to also join up with them in early March to lend a hand and deliver more kit.

ICC Level 2 Course - Jinja, Uganda

CWB tutors delivered an ICC Level 2 course for 12 candidates in Uganda, coaches from the MCCF supported hubs in Masindi, Gulu and Lira were in attendance.

ICC Foundation Course - Masindi, Uganda

A face 2 face foundation course for teachers and young leaders was delivered by Patrick the CWB trained ICC tutor and Masindi lead caoach. 18 new coaches were trained.

Competition in Mahama - Rwanda

Weekly sessions are still being hosted in the Mahama Refugee camp, another festival day was held there with support from the Rwanda Cricket Association.

Orange Cup - Koshi, Nepal

The First Edition of Orange Cup 2024 was introduced in solidarity with 16 days of Activism against Gender Based Violence with a collective effort of Nepal Cricket Foundation, MCC Foundation, CWB, and Koshi Province.

Dignified Menstruation Cup - Madesh, Nepal
